Dear Parents/Carers,

British Science Week is here again!

We are going to be celebrating British Science Week in school from 8th to 17th March. Science Week is a tenday celebration of science, technology, engineering, and maths. This year marks the 30th anniversary of British Science Week and so the theme for this year is 'Time'. We aim to inspire our pupils to investigate and discover elements of time, in a variety of ways. Throughout the week, children will take part in a range of activities based around the theme of 'time'. We will also be joined in school by Professor Dan Tastic, who will deliver 'Science Week Spectacular' workshops to all classes from nursery to Year 6.

We would like to invite pupils to get creative and enter the British Science Week annual, UK-wide poster competition! To enter, they simply need to create a poster which fits in with the theme of 'Time'. Students could create a poster showing how a certain type of technology has changed over time, or even the advancement of time-telling technology itself. Budding poster makers could also go futuristic show us how they think the world might look in years to come, or perhaps look at nature – lifecycles, lifespans, evolution, and hibernation – nature is full of timely topics.

The poster must be on A3 or A4 paper. Children can use pop up pictures, pull out tabs or materials such as pencils, paints, crayons, and paper to create their posters. We will then select the 5 best creations and submit them for a chance of winning an array of prizes.

Your poster must be submitted to your child's class teacher by Monday 18th March 2024.
