Once Upon a Time

This project supports children to develop a love of stories and reading. It encourages children to learn, retell and act out familiar and traditional tales including Cinderella, Goldilocks, Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs and The Three Billy Goats Gruff.

In the Once Upon a Time project, your child will be introduced to the wonderful world of stories. They will listen to a range of traditional tales and have the chance to act out the stories in their play. They will also listen to alternative contemporary stories to see different viewpoints from the characters. They will use the stories to think about how life has changed from when the stories were written. They will also make up their own stories and make masks, props and puppets to act out their stories.

Supporting your child at home

- Read traditional stories and fairy tales to your child.
- Visit your local library and choose picture books to share.
- Talk about the characters in stories and whether they like or dislike them.
- Talk about how the characters in stories behave and what they could do differently.

Messages

Morning Activities

Every morning (from 8:45am—9am). Parents/carers are welcome to join their child/children in Nursery to help them settle in and enjoy different activities with them in the classroom. This is also a great opportunity to speak to the class teacher/teaching assistant about Nursery and have a look at your child's classroom.

Donations to Nursery's extra-curricular activities

It would be very much appreciated if you could give your extra-curricular donations to the school office on a termly basis. The money will contribute towards a range of activities including baking and festival food. There is an in depth list on the letter in your nursery pack. A suggested donation would be £8.00 each term or £24.00 for the year. We would be grateful if donations could be paid on the first day of each term in September, January and April. This can be paid at the school office.

Water bottles, Bookbags and School Uniform

In Nursery the children have access to water all day. School water bottles can be bought from the school office (£1.20) or you can bring a water bottle from home. Please add your child's name to their water bottle. If you wish to buy a school book bag or uniform (optional) these can be bought from Moses and Ziggys in Rochdale.

Bookbags are very useful for sending home important letters and the children's work.

Nursery Entrances & Exits

We use different entrances to drop off and pick up at nursery. Please see the times below.

Nursery Entrance- drop off -Morning drop off is at 8:45am through the main nursery door only which is next to the ball park at the front of school.

School Main Entrance- Morning pick up at 11:45am, Lunch time drop off at 11:30am (for lunch) or 12:45pm for the afternoon session and afternoon pick up at 2:45pm (depending on your child's hours).

The school main entrance is also used to drop off and pick up for dragons den (our before and after school club). The door to dragons den is located to the left inside the main entrance.

Nursery Exit- pick up -At 3:45pm the children leave nursery from the conservatory door at the back of nursery. Access to this is through the nursery outdoor area next to the main playground.

Nursery Rewards

Every week we celebrate the children's work and achievements during our 'Celebration time'. Children's photos will be displayed on the proud wall if they win a certificate and we will share this with you on Tapestry. Children receive certificates for Star of the Week (whole school reward) and for being the Dojo winner (whole school reward). The staff at lunch time also choose a lunchtime superstar for the week. We also have a treasure tin of prizes at nursery which the children can choose from as part of their rewards and if they win star of the week. If they win the dojo award they also get to take Monty the dojo monster home for the weekend.

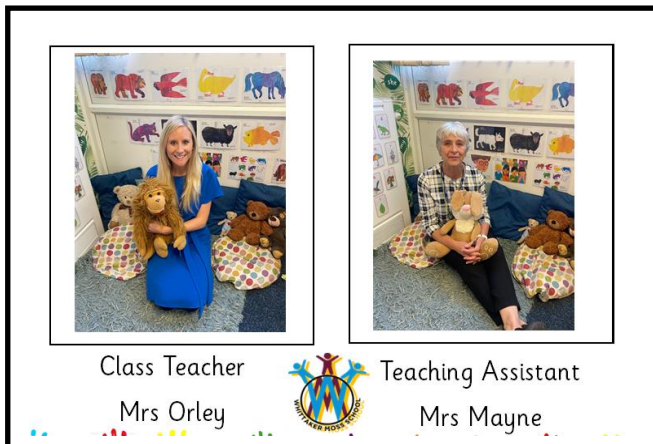

Dojo Points
