## Changes to lunches from September

At this time each year I write to you regarding changes to the price of main meals.

Please note the change to the lunchtime meal deal. Due to rising fuel and food costs, <u>from September</u> <u>2022 the cost will be £2.30</u>. The local authority are recommending that we raise prices by 10p per meal, however at this point and in light of the current economic climate we have taken the decision not to do this at present.

Students will still be able to purchase a main meal or equivalent choice and a dessert as a meal deal. We continue to provide water around school but would ask that **your child has a refillable bottle** so that they have a drink throughout the school day. Students are able to purchase juice or milkshakes in a carton at an additional cost to their meal deal.

#### Vaccinations programme

Please note that parents and carers with students currently in Years 7-10 will receive a separate letter from the Community nursing team reminding you about the vaccination programme. Please take up the opportunities throughout the school year. If you have any queries regarding a specific vaccination that your child is due to receive, you can contact the team via the Phoenix Centre in Heywood.

### **General reminders for September**

Students should return to school in full school uniform. Please remind your child that earrings or other piercings are **not permitted in school**. Should your child wish to have their ears pierced, I would recommend doing this at the start of the summer break as they will be asked to remove them. Please be aware that make up, false nails and jewellery of any kind are not part of our school uniform and are not permitted in school.

With regard to hair, please can parents and carers ensure that unnatural dye colours are removed before the start of September to comply with school policy. Similarly, extreme haircuts are not permitted. No patterns or lines are permitted in hair or eyebrows.

Changes have been made to reduce the number of badged items within the uniform as well as looking to make it more affordable for parents and carers. **Mobile phones:** Parents and carers are reminded that mobile phones are not permitted in school. We accept that students will have their mobile phone with them as they travel to and from school, however it should be switched off as they enter the school site and placed in their bag. The school does not take responsibility for loss or damage to a mobile phone. Students using a mobile phone in school will have it confiscated and they will be issued with a 20 mins detention at the end of the school day after which their phone will be handed back. Parents and carers will be made aware via text / email.

Attendance: Our attendance target for 2022.23 for all students at Holy Family College is 97%. In order for our students to be successful in life they need to take every opportunity with regard to their learning, if students are not in school they cannot be successful learners. Holidays taken during term time will not be authorised by school. Please be aware that fixed penalty fines may be issued if students do not attend school.

**Students arriving late to school, after 8.35am** will receive a late mark and a 20 mins lunchtime detention. Where there is persistent lateness to school home will be contacted to discuss how we can work together to ensure students arrive on time.

**Set/ Class changes for September:** at this time of year we review student placements within groups. There are some class changes for some students at the start of the next academic year. Where students require more challenge in their learning or more support there is the need to move them so that they are appropriately placed ready for September.

In some year groups this is also due to an increase in the number of classes within the subject in order to provide smaller class sizes and more support in the lesson. This is particularly the case as students move up the school.
